Facilitator Instructions:

1. Break parents and scholars into three groups.
2. Disperse a scenario sheet to each group (choose between scenario 1 or 2).
3. Groups should create a SHORT skit that shows each family acting out the scenario without the use of technology.

Example: Group 1 scenario is **getting ready for school**. There is no alarm clock, no hot water heater, and no iron. Group 1 then must act out the scenario of how they will get ready for school without the items listed.

GROUP 1

Scenario 1: You must get ready for school/work in the morning. However, you do not have an alarm clock or indoor plumbing.

Scenario 2: You are flying into Ohio tomorrow and need to check the weather before you pack, however, there are no weather apps available.

GROUP 2

Scenario 1: Your mom has left you and your siblings' leftovers for dinner. You must warm up the food, but microwaves and toaster ovens have not been invented yet.

Scenario 2: You must drive from Atlanta to Miami, but there is not a navigation system.

GROUP 3

Scenario 1: You must wash clothes, but you do not have a washing machine or dryer.

Scenario 2: You have a research paper due, but cannot use a computer, Wi-Fi, or the internet.
